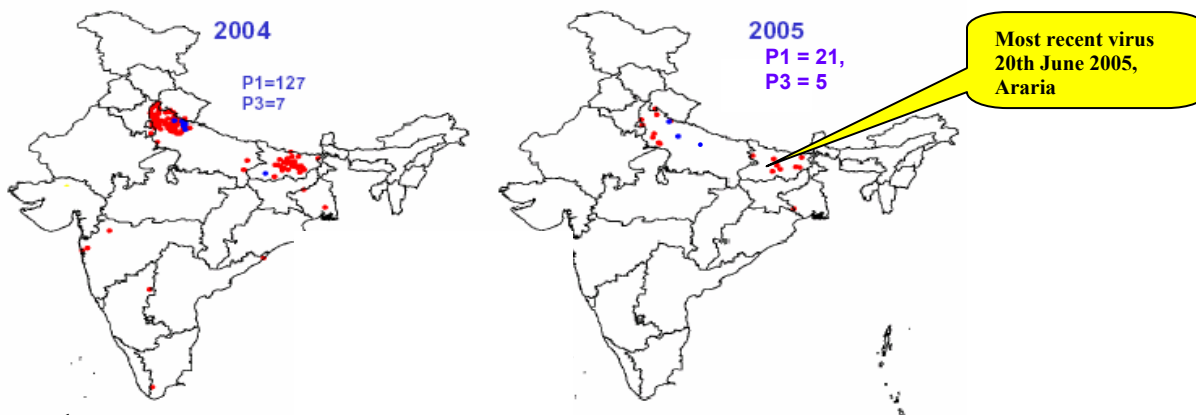


## Progress – Global & India (Polio Eradication)

- Most countries are polio free and Polio cases restricted to few countries only
- India is doing very well, contributing to only – 3-4% cases of Global load in 2005
- Most States in India are polio free for variable periods
- Intensified efforts are going on in high risk areas, for underserved community and for people in transit.

### Surveillance

- Sensitive AFP Surveillance is an essential part of eradication strategy. Missing any case at this crucial juncture is not only detrimental to the programme but also misleading.
- **Immediate Reporting of all Acute Flaccid Paralysis cases (syndromic approach) in less than 15 years is a must. (Cases with onset of paralysis upto 6 month back at any point of time to be reported)**

All cases to be reported with detailed address and contact number *irrespective of :-*

1. Cases seen in OPD / Casualty / Wards / going LAMA
2. Clinical diagnosis of the case
3. Local or outstation patients
4. Patient coming directly to you or referred cases.

Any doubtful, border line case or under investigation case to be first reported without waiting for final diagnosis.
